As a camper, I learned how to clean a toilet, sweep a rug, share my space and make my bed...things I had never done growing up in my privileged home. They are lessons needed in everyday life forever. I also learned to ride a horse, hike a mountain, rappel, shoot a rifle, make a bird feeder out of pine cones, and cook in a wood-burning stove. These are things that usually aren't available in the city. I was also able to be "me"... not the expected "me" of school and family, but just "me." I sat on a log and wrote poetry, I spoke in chapel service, I was a waitress in the mess hall...all very new and formative experiences.

As a parent, I watched my children blossom at Blue Mountain. They developed a love for nature and outdoors, and realized the importance of caring for our natural resources. They learned to work as a team with their cabins and in sporting events, and to utilize their gifts in harmony with others. They learned compassion for children who lived in different family situations than their own, and they learned leadership from the counselors and staff. They even learned to enjoy sleeping under the stars on campouts.
